

# Horicon Jr/Sr High School Summer School Information 2017

Available to students who have completed grades 6-11

*Students interested in remedial or make-up classes must see the school counselor for registration material. Space is limited.*

Consider enrollment in a summer school course to:

- Retain knowledge by continuing study through the summer
- Explore topics outside the traditional curriculum by enrolling in enrichment courses
- Earn credit to apply towards elective requirements for graduation

Driver's Education will also meet Wednesday June 7 and Thursday June 8

Classes will be held from 8:00 to 10:00 a.m. and 10:00 to 12:00 p.m.

**A student enrolled in Driver's Education and at least one parent MUST ATTEND the organizational meeting on Wednesday, May 10<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 p.m. in the High School Cafeteria. This time counts towards the required minutes to complete the class.**

## **Transportation/Supervision:**

Bus service will be provided to district students who are eligible for transportation during the school year. However, the bus will only bring students to school at 7:45 a.m. and return at 12:00 p.m. **Consequently, should you want to use the bus service, students must enroll in two courses.** If a bus student wishes to enroll in only one course, families must arrange their own transportation to and from class. There will be no supervision of students who are not in class and students may not remain on campus unsupervised.

## **Attendance:**

Classes offered for high school students will earn one quarter credit for each summer class successfully completed. Therefore, attendance is critical. **More than one absence (excused or unexcused) will result in the student being dropped from the class.** Make up time is not an option.

## **Fee:**

Fees are required for some courses – see the course description. A \$250.00 (\$300.00 for non-residents) fee is required for the Behind the Wheel portion of the Driver's Education course. Payment is required prior to the student's first scheduled driving lesson.

Enrollment numbers will determine whether a course will be offered. Insufficient enrollment will prevent a course from being held. Parents and students will be notified if a course is dropped so that students may enroll in another course. Courses will be filled on a first-come basis.

## **COURSE DESCRIPTIONS:**

**CSI Crime Scene** (1/4 HS credit) **Grades 7-12** **10:00 class**  
Turn the classroom into a CSI laboratory. Can you solve the mystery? Enter the crime scene, create a list of suspects, check alibis and background stories. Analyze the skin, hair, fingerprints and blood left at the scene. Find the criminal before it is too late. Grades 7-12 - HS students can earn science credit. Uses reading through creating crime scene, writing the story line, backgrounds and alibis of the suspects. Students will also learn aspects of mystery writing to create mystery stories. Uses math in data collection and analysis.

**Delicious, Nutritious Horicon** **\$5.00 fee** (1/4 HS credit) **Grades 7-12** **8:00 class**  
Students will learn healthy eating by gardening. A variety of healthy food items will be prepared and sampled by the students. Students will also learn a variety of gardening skills they can use at home.

**Driver's Education** **\$250 BTW fee** (1/4 HS credit) **Grades 9-12** **8:00 & 10:00 classes**  
The student will learn to safely and legally operate a motor vehicle, the function of traffic laws and enforcement, factors which interfere with an individual's capability to drive, and forces outside of the person which affects the control of the vehicle. Specific skills students will develop include angle and parallel parking, parking on a hill, U and Y turns, and yielding right of way. Scheduling of Behind the Wheel lessons will be done with the instructor during the classroom session.

Driver's Education students and at least one parent **must attend** the organizational meeting on **Wednesday, May 10<sup>th</sup>, 5:30 pm**, HJSHS cafeteria. This meeting counts toward the required minutes to pass this class.

**Frolf and Golf** (1/4 HS credit) **Grades 7-12** **10:00 class**  
Want something fun to do outside? Do you want something you can always do once you learn, then this is the course for you. In Frolf and Golf students will have one week of each of reading, interpreting & learning the rules, as well as, techniques, calculations, strategy and fundamentals of these lifelong games. Whether you have played before or not, upon finishing this course you will feel comfortable and energetic about playing.

**Jr High Weight Training and Conditioning** **Grades 7-8** **8:00 class**  
We are here to PUMP you UP! This class will help students develop basic strength training skills. Students will be engaged in a total body lifting program to help build functional strength. Students will also have the opportunity to participate in a sport or fitness activity of their choice at the end of each class. All Junior High students that participate in the introductory class are welcome to come to open weight room for the remainder of summer from 8:00-10:00.

**Myth Busters** (1/4 HS credit) **Grades 7-12** **8:00 class**  
Like the show? You will love the class. Test some common myths and bust or confirm them. Will putting a stamp on helicopter blades make it crash? Can ninjas walk on water? Part of the class will be to develop a Rube Goldberg invention. Can you build a better mousetrap? Can you design a chain reaction machine? Let's see. Grades 7-12 - HS students can earn science credit. Students will use math calculations and measurements, scientific method, engineering and statistical analysis.

**Weight Training and Conditioning** (1/4 HS credit) **Grades 9-12** **10:00 class**  
Get JACKED in the weight room. Students will have the opportunity to reach new levels in the weight room. Athletes can work to develop sport specific training while anyone can work to get stronger and more confident in the weight room. Students will also have the opportunity to participate in a sport or fitness activity of their choice at the end of each class.

**Mock Trial** (1/4 HS credit) **Grades 7-12** **10:00 class**  
What is there to learn about the American legal system? In this class, students will be exposed to the requirements needed for a Mock Trial team at the High School. Students will be introduced to legal terminology, legal structure, and the creation of a persuasive argument. The case assigned to the 2017-2018 academic year by the National HS Mock Trial Championship will be the focus of the class.

**Self Defense**                      **\$10.00 fee**                      **(1/4 HS credit)**                      **Grades 7-12**                      **8:00 class**

\*Disclaimer: This is for self-DEFENSE - this is NOT fight club. We will discuss anti-bullying techniques, ways to prevent fights, and worse case scenarios if you have to defend yourself. Based around the teachings of TaeKwonDo, we will learn honesty, integrity, perseverance, self-control, and having an indomitable spirit, along with strikes, kicks, blocks, forms, and board-breaking.

**Woodworking**                      **\$10.00 fee**                      **(1/4 HS credit)**                      **Grades 7-12**                      **8:00 class**

If new to woodworking, you will learn the fundamentals of woodworking, safety, and creativity. If you've taken woods before, this course will expand your knowledge of intermediate skills and advanced applications. This course will guide you in becoming a better wood-worker and improve your math and plan-reading skills as you develop projects. Projects range from outdoor feeders to inside decorations and furniture.
