This week's topic "*School Safety: Building Security*" is a priority for our School Board, our District and Administration. The mission of providing secure schools has been a focus throughout our country as we strive to provide improved security for all schools.

#### Building Security – Entrance/Entry Security:



Modern security concerns dictate that monitored and electronically controlled entrances with a secondary set of doors and handicapped access is best for controlling entry to our schools. Such an entrance must be easily viewed by the staff responsible for allowing entry to the public as well as be monitored via both security camera and electronically locked.

Entry by staff or students should also be controlled by electronic lock as well as covered by security cameras.

Currently the High School has 10 entrances to the building but only 5 are electronically locked or monitored by security camera.



The main entrance to the campus currently is the only one with a both a second set of doors and camera coverage.

#### Building Security – Interior & Exterior Building Security:

The existing High School has a limited number of security cameras with several in need of replacement.



Coverage is limited in the interior with no coverage to the exterior of the building or parking areas. The current Security Camera System is out of date with no warranty, support or expansion ability for the number of cameras required to cover the current building and grounds.

Interior doors to classrooms and common areas are in need of additional manual locking mechanisms that would deter unwanted entry in time of emergency as well as rekeying to a common master lock. Such additions would not only secure, but also allow quick access to emergency personal responding in time of need.

## ENTRANCE, INTERIOR & EXTERIOR SECURITY

### Implementing New and Additional Building Security Measures:

With passage of Referendum Question #1: Construction of a New Elementary School, the District will implement the following Security Measures:

**NOTE: Question #2 High School Infrastructure Update does NOT include these Measures:**

- **Secured Entrances** to the combined Campuses with both primary and secondary electronically locked and monitored entrance doors.
- **Dedicated New staff and Student Drop off areas** for entrance to the campus
- **Updating the entrance door control system**, adding additional electronic monitoring to all existing entrances as well as the new construction with the ability to expand for future needs
- **Adding additional Manual Security Measures** to all interior entrances to classrooms and common areas
- **Replacing the current Security Camera System** to cover all interior and exterior common areas of the campus with expansion capacity for any future needs
- **Change interior door locks** to consistent keying for administrative and emergency access

This consolidation provides a more economical implementation of these measures and costs as well as providing future expansion opportunities. The combined campus will also allow rerouting staff, student and general public traffic or

access to dedicated entrances that can be secured separately for daily schedules and extracurricular or special events held outside of regular school hours.
