Kindergarten Art	
Goals of elementary art: Students experience and develop art techniques, identify and attempt various styles of art, experiment with different types of media, learn about different cultures and various artists, and gain an understanding of the purpose of art.	
Lines and Shapes	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will be able to create different types of lines Students will be exposed to abstract and realistic forms of art created by various artists Students will create art by drawing and painting 	
Shape Collages	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will practice using shapes in art and gain an understanding about how artists use shapes to create art Students will learn colors and that they can be grouped into families: primary and secondary Students will create art using collage method 	
Texture Animals	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will experientially discover how there are different textures in the world around us Students will discover how to create a texture rubbing Students will continue to create art using collage, working on cutting and pasting skills Students will use various shapes and be able to recognize them 	
Pumpkin Painting	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will practice using and identifying various colors and shapes in order to draw things from life Students will draw objects from life and overlap them and use horizon line to create a sense of space Students will gain an understanding of colors, their families, and how to mix them together and create other color: secondary colors (orange, green, and purple) 	
Three Dimensional Art	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will learn how to create 3d art through making a pinch pot and a 3d cardboard sculpture Students will discover how to create 3d art by using additive method of construction Students will apply primary and secondary colors 	

Patterns and Colors
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Students will become familiar with two types of patterns• Students will continue to use shape to create objects in drawings• Students will create and use color families such as warm and cool• Students will create various forms of art by using varied media and methods, such as stamping, printing, and scraping
Spring Themes (Animals and Insects) <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Students will draw spring animals using shapes to create body and head• Students will use resist methods, wet on wet watercolor, cutting and pasting and stamping methods

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First Grade Art

Goals of elementary art: Students experience and develop art techniques, identify and attempt various styles of art, experiment with different types of media, learn about different cultures and various artists, and gain an understanding of the purpose of art.

Cup Full of Pencils Drawing

- Students will understand what draw from observation is and be able to draw a still life object
- Students will gain practice and understanding about using shapes and volumes to create a sense of space
- Students will create a sense of space by using overlapping and horizon line in art work

Self Portraits

- Students will be able to draw the shape and features of a face
- Students will mix natural face pigment colors to paint the face
- Students will be able to use paint to mix various colors and complete portrait and background

Abstract Cityscape

- Students will study the art of Schulten and paint using tints
- Students will gain an understanding of how different artists show objects from life in different ways
- Students will create artwork which changes reality through simplification and shape while creating an abstract city

Fish Bowl Collage

- Students will compare and contrast artists who demonstrate painting things in life (Matisse's fish and Schulten's cities)
- Students will create paintings by using wet on wet and wet on dry methods of painting and will create art using collage method
- Students will use 3d shapes to create a fish bowl (cone, sphere, cylinder)
- Students will use warm and cool color families

Abstract Paper Collage

- Students will review term abstract and create a collage from bright colors
- Students will review and use the terms 3d and 2d
- Students will learn how the same artist will represent things differently and use different media and technique

Clay Snowman and Clay Heart
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will learn how to create 3d art from clay by using addition method and slab method • Students will learn the term sculpture as being a 3d object in art
Animal Drawing
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will discover that an author writes books and an illustrator is an artist who creates pictures for books • Students will examine the work of Jan Brett and understand how to create a sketch for an illustration • Students will create their own illustration based on a Jan Brett book and use pattern and texture to create realism
Charcoal Animal Pose Drawing
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will be able to draw animals using gesture drawings shapes and charcoal, complete with fur texture and a variety of poses (front, side, profile, and foreshortened) to create realism
Paper Weaving
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will create a paper weaving using a paper loom • Students will gain experience with over/under pattern, and warp and weft parts of weaving as an art process

Students will be able to meet the learning targets above as evidenced by formative and summative classroom assessments.

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Second Grade Art

Goals of elementary art: Students experience and develop art techniques, identify and attempt various styles of art, experiment with different types of media, learn about different cultures and various artists, and gain an understanding of the purpose of art.

Still life Bottle Painting

- Students will demonstrate drawing 3d forms such as cones and cylinders when drawing bottles.
- Students will overlap and use horizon line to show sense of space
- Students will use the primary color family in their art and their ability to create secondary colors from them
- Students will use their observation skills to draw the shape of each bottle

Pumpkin Drawing

- Students will continue to develop their observation skill by drawing two overlapping pumpkins.
- Students will show sense of space by using overlapping, size change, and horizon line
- Students will demonstrate they know how to shade and have shadows using a drawing pencil

Pumpkin Pot and Clay Hedgehog Sculpture

- Students will create a pinch pot and have features such as texture and use of additive clay method
- Students will create a hedgehog using above methods and correctly color both clay objects using paint mixing

Seasonal Cloth Quilt

- Students will gain an understanding of quilting as a form of art work
- Students will complete a quilt square using an applique form of quilting
- Students will demonstrate their design knowledge using similar linking colors and patterns to create cloth

Owl Oil Pastel Resist Painting

- Students will use observational skills and use of shapes by drawing an owl
- Students will demonstrate knowledge of patterns by creating them on their owl
- Students will distinguish between primary and secondary colors and demonstrate how to make purple, orange, and green
- Students will be able to distinguish between realistic and abstract art

Primary/Secondary Paper Collage

- Students will study the work of Mondrian and review the difference between abstract and realistic

styles of art.

- Students will use geometric shapes and right angles to create a geometric collage using only primary or secondary colors.

Fruit Bowl Life Drawing
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will learn to observe objects from life and sketch them • Students will place objects in composition to demonstrate overlapping and size change • Watercolor techniques will be introduced and students will demonstrate competency with medium
Fall Leaf Painting
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will examine an object from life and draw it using the style of art realism • Students will use contour lines in art as a drawing technique • Students will learn the wet on wet and wet on dry methods of watercolor and watercolor pencils as a medium • Students will show texture and three-dimensionality in drawing
Clay Slab Animals and Apple Pinch Pots
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will demonstrate how to create art using clay methods: slab and pinch • Students will be able to distinguish between abstract 3d forms and realistic style of art
Junk Art Collage and Print
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will learn what the term found object art means and how to use objects around them to construct a collage • Students will learn how to use and place objects to create a composition which shows line, shape and texture • Students will gain understanding about found object artists create and display their art • Students will create a monoprint using printing methods and a monotone color palette • The art term “faux” will be discussed and demonstrated with the application of metallic paint
Castle Drawings
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will be able to create a sense of space by using horizon line and size change • Students will be able to use cylinders and rectangles to complete a castle drawing • Students will be able to demonstrate use of shading and shadow to create texture, sense of light and dimension • Students will demonstrate perspective as a way of showing depth in 2d art

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Learning Targets

4th Grade Art

Goals of elementary art: Students experience and develop art techniques, identify and attempt various styles of art, experiment with different types of media, learn about different cultures and various artists, and gain an understanding of the purpose of art.

Still Life/Bones Drawing

- Students learn what contour drawing is and uses contour lines in realistic drawing
- Students create a complete composition using a sense of space by using overlapping, horizon line, and size change
- Students use value and shadow to create dimensionality in art with a drawing pencil
- Students will be exposed to artists who paint and draw nature objects

Abstraction From Life Objects

- Students gain understanding of the difference between abstract art and realism
- Students can demonstrate abstraction by exaggeration, simplification, and enlarging
- Students can use chalk as a medium by creating gradation and color change

Bird Sculpture and Clay Mask

- Students use clay as a medium to create 3d art
- Students demonstrate carving and building skills with clay
- Students create a sculpture by using pinch pot method and slab method
- Students will become familiar with masks from different cultures around the world and their purposes those cultures

Yarn Weavings

- Students demonstrate weaving technique using yarn
- Students understand that weaving is an ancient art used across cultures
- Students use repeating colors in an AB or ABC pattern
- Students take off weaving completely and displays it on paper

Impressionist Style Landscape

- Students use sense of space in a landscape drawing: overlapping, size change and perspective
- Students demonstrate knowledge of Impressionist style of art with brushstrokes
- Students demonstrate color change to convey depth and ability to use oil pastels correctly

Fantasy Art (Dragons)
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Students will be able to create a gesture sketch of a dragon using shapes• Students will use gestural sketches to complete a realistic drawing complete with texture, shading, and background (use of space)• Students will demonstrate their ability to use choose media and color to convey their type of dragon

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Learning Targets

5th grade Art

Goals of elementary art: Students experience and develop art techniques, identify and attempt various styles of art, experiment with different types of media, learn about different cultures and various artists, and gain an understanding of the purpose of art.

3D Volume Drawing

- Students will be able to draw three different three dimensional volumes from life
- Students will create a sense of space by using overlapping, horizon line, and size change
- Students will demonstrate their knowledge of value by shading dark to light within the volumes with a drawing pencil
- Students will differentiate between abstract and realism

Abstract Pumpkin Collage

- Students will create an optical illusion drawing using size change, spacing , and repetitive shapes
- Students will create art in the abstract style, collage method
- Students will gain understanding how artists express themselves through their art (artist: Yoyoi Kusuma)

Clay Animal Sculpture

- Students will create a clay sculpture using an additive form of sculpture
- Students will create a pinch pot, with additive features and finish using glaze for color
- Students will demonstrate their ability to work from a sketch or plan

Abstract Animal Face Collage

- Students will create a collage by ripping and attaching various papers
- Students will gain understanding of the difference between 2d and 3D and collage as being dimensional art
- Students will learn how to create a realistic eye, drawing from life, using shading and gradation
- Students will be familiar with the term multimedia and develop several drawings incorporating line, shape, color, and texture using media of their choice, which has varied results

Oaxacan-inspired Wood Sculpture

- Students will be able to create a wood sculpture using the additive sculpting method
- Students will implement designs and patterns which are in the style of abstract
- Students will demonstrate abstraction through simplification and exaggeration with wood sculpture
- Students will understand that different areas of the world use art to earn money and to express their cultural identity (Oaxacan)

Metal Repoussé
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Students will create metal art based on English design and lettering• Students will gain understanding of the metal repousse process of creating depth in a composition using appropriate tools
