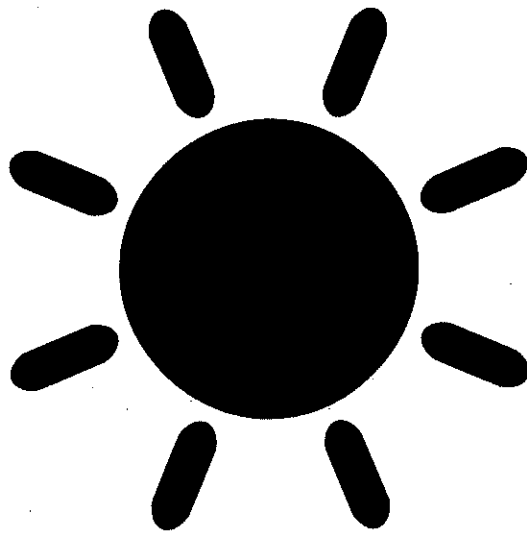

On behalf of the Horicon School District, we are excited to welcome you to our 2019 Summer School Program! We have many new and interesting classes to offer and look forward to providing these great opportunities for your child!

This year our summer school program times are **8:00-10:00 a.m. and 10:00-12:00 p.m.** Our program will be held **Monday-Thursday** from June 10th to June 27th. There will be no summer school on Fridays. Driver's Ed will also meet on May 15, June 4, 5, and 6. See the class offerings list for more information.

Classes should be selected according to the grade your child is ENTERING in the fall. For each session please number TWO possible choices. In the event your child's class selection reaches capacity, we will contact you to assign an alternate choice. Please complete one form per student.

Classes will be assigned on a first-come, first-serve basis. All classes, with the exception of Driver's Ed, are FREE this year! We are confident that this will be a fun and enriching experience for all of our students.



Horicon Jr/Sr High School Summer School Information 2019

Available to students who have completed grades 6-11

***Students interested in remedial or make-up classes through E2020/Edgenuity must see the school counselor for registration material.
Space is limited.***

Consider enrollment in a summer school course to:

- Retain knowledge by continuing study through the summer
- Explore topics outside the traditional curriculum by enrolling in enrichment courses
- Earn credit to apply towards elective requirements for graduation

Classes will be held from **8:00 to 10:00 a.m.** and **10:00 to 12:00 p.m.**

*****Driver's Education will also meet June 4, June 5, and June 6 at the regular class times.***

A student enrolled in Driver's Education and at least one parent MUST ATTEND the organizational meeting on Wednesday, May 15th at 5:30 p.m. in the High School Cafeteria. This time counts towards the required minutes to complete the class.

Transportation/Supervision:

Bus service **will not** be provided this summer. There will be no supervision of students who are not in class and students may not remain on campus unsupervised.

Attendance:

Classes offered for high school students will earn one-quarter credit for each summer school class successfully completed. Therefore, attendance is critical. **More than one absence (excused or unexcused) will result in the student being dropped from the class.** Makeup time is **not** an option.

Fee:

There are no general fees for regular summer school courses.

A \$250.00 (\$300.00 for non-residents) fee is required for the Behind the Wheel portion of the Driver's Education course. Payment is required prior to the student's first scheduled driving lesson.

Enrollment numbers will determine whether a course will be offered. Insufficient enrollment will prevent a course from being held. Parents and students will be notified if a course is dropped so that students may enroll in another course. Courses will be filled on a first-come basis.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

CSI Crime Scene (1/4 HS credit) **Grades 7-12** **8:00 class**

Turn the classroom into a CSI laboratory. Can you solve the mystery? Enter the crime scene, create a list of suspects, check alibis and background stories. Analyze the skin, hair, fingerprints and blood left at the scene. Find the criminal before it is too late. Grades 7-12 - HS students can earn an elective credit. Uses reading through creating crime scenes, writing the storyline, backgrounds, and alibis of the suspects. Students will also learn aspects of mystery writing to create mystery stories. Uses math in data collection and analysis.

Driver's Education \$250 Behind the Wheel fee (1/4 HS credit) **Grades 9-12** **8:00 or 10:00 class**

NOTE: Also meets June 4, 5, 6

Students will learn to safely and legally operate a motor vehicle, the function of traffic laws and enforcement, factors which interfere with an individual's capability to drive, and forces outside of the person which affects the control of the vehicle. Specific skills students will develop include angle and parallel parking, parking on a hill, U and Y turns and yielding right of way. Scheduling of Behind the Wheel lessons will be done with the instructor during the classroom session.

Driver's Education students and at least one parent **must attend** the organizational meeting on **Wednesday, May 15th, 5:30 pm**, HJSHS cafeteria. This meeting counts toward the required minutes to pass this class.

Girl's Basketball Concepts **Grades 7-9** **10:00 class**

Dribble, Pass, Shoot! Do you want to learn more about basketball? Do you want to improve your basketball skills or take your skills to the next level? Are you thinking about playing on a basketball team and want to become a better player? Then we would love to have you join us! We will learn how shooting percentages and other scoring works, as well as investigating basketball rules. We will be doing lots of games and fun competitions to improve our skills and become all-around better basketball players and team members.

Girl's Volleyball Concepts **Grades 7-9** **8:00 class**

Bump, Set, Spike! Do you want to learn more about volleyball? Do you want to improve your skills? Are you thinking about playing on a girls volleyball team? Then this class is for you! We will learn how to score and will take a deep dive into the written rules of volleyball as we grow in our skills. We will be doing lots of fun competitions and games to become better overall volleyball players, team players, and learners of the game.

It's a Mystery (1/4 HS credit) **Grades 7-12** **10:00 class**

Part MythBusters, Part Unsolved Mysteries. Our world is full of things we haven't found answers to. Let's explore these and see if we can solve the puzzle. Use your imagination and create a mystery story of your own. Part of the class is to create our own escape room. Let's see if we can solve the riddle and escape from the room. Another part of the class will be to develop a Rube Goldberg invention. Can you build a better mousetrap? Can you design a chain reaction machine? Let's see. Grades 7-12 - HS students can earn elective credit. Students will use math calculations and measurements, scientific method, engineering, and statistical analysis. In addition, we will use reading by researching aspects of these unexplained phenomena. Students will also learn aspects of mystery writing to create mystery stories.

Jr High Weight Training and Conditioning**Grades 7-8****8:00 class**

We are here to PUMP you UP! This class will help students develop basic strength training skills. Students will be engaged in a total body lifting program to help build functional strength. Students will also have the opportunity to participate in a sport or fitness activity of their choice at the end of each class. We'd prefer these grade levels but if the time doesn't work in your schedule you can come to the other session. We'll modify the class to meet your needs.

Self Defense**(1/4 HS credit) Grades 7-12****8:00 or 10:00 class**

Disclaimer: This is NOT Fight Club Studying sections of the Korean art of Taekwondo, Filipino art of Eskrima, and Brazilian art of Jiu-Jitsu, we practice the tenants of Honesty, Integrity, Perseverance, Self-Control, and having an Indomitable Spirit; de-escalation and anti-bullying techniques; and self-defense/abduction prevention. We work together to learn and train, not harm. If there's time, we will practice board-breaking, sparring, and other techniques. If you have taken this in the past or have some training, still sign-up to practice, learn more, and help others as well!

HS Weight Training and Conditioning**(1/4 HS credit)****Grades 9-12****10:00 class**

Get JACKED in the weight room. Students will have the opportunity to reach new levels in the weight room. Athletes can work to develop sport specific training while anyone can work to get stronger and more confident in the weight room. Students will also have the opportunity to participate in a sport or fitness activity of their choice at the end of each class. We'd prefer these grade levels but if the time doesn't work in your schedule you can come to the other session. We'll modify the class to meet your needs.

Woodworking**(1/4 HS credit)****Grades 7-12****8:00 or 10:00 class**

If new to this course it will go over the fundamentals of woodworking, safety, and creativity. If you've taken woods before this course will expand your knowledge about intermediate skills and advanced applications. Whether you worked with wood before or not this course will guide you into becoming a better woodworker and improve math and plan reading skills as you develop projects. Projects will range from shut box games to decorative flowers and outside decor.
